Shiplap can bring a cool coastal vibe to any interior. Originally a means of exterior weatherproofing, shiplap is now used in casual homes to add dimension to walls. Here, we used it as an accent on the wall with the entertainment center and shelving, but it can be carried throughout a room, including the ceiling, or used to highlight a specific feature like a fireplace. For an unusual - and stunning - conference or dining table, consider Olive Ash Burl. This wood combines blonds and true browns in a swirling pattern and is often more intensely figured than similar burls such as Mappa. It also makes a statement in humidors or on millwork.
